

UNIVERSITY OF ARTS IN BELGRADE

ABOUT

The University of Arts in Belgrade was founded in 1957 as an association of four art faculties: the Faculty of Music, the Faculty of Fine Arts, the Faculty of Applied Arts and the Faculty of Dramatic Arts. Today, it comprises 2.700 students, more than 470 professors and 70 study programmes in diverse arts disciplines, on undergraduate, master and doctoral level. With the aim to be recognized as a staging ground for new ideas, the University of Arts has developed specific ways of focusing and directing arts education, unifying artistic and theoretical research and providing a platform for interdisciplinary research. Recently launched practice based doctoral programmes in arts make the University of Arts an exceptional higher education institution in the Region.

Connecting traditional experience with contemporary innovations, the University of Arts achieves the highest goals, holding onto fruitful principles: strict selection and a small number of students, teaching process intertwined with professional sector, mentorship and the fact that most of the teachers are at the same time prominent artists. At the University of Arts, young people's talent and creativity are transformed into artistic careers. Students are directed towards their future professions and trained for future artistic practice. Our alumni are well-known artists and leaders in diverse institutions of art and culture.


The University of Arts has profoundly influenced the development of culture and art in our country and the whole region. Being the torchbearer of artistic life, the University of Arts has a decisive contribution in setting up artistic criteria and supporting foundation of other outstanding art faculties in the Region. The bridge connecting artistic practice and theory, individual and group artistic creation, professionalism and artistic freedom, as well as endeavors to connect different artistic and theoretical disciplines in a multidisciplinary way, represent the essential teaching distinctiveness of the University of Arts and ensure its high position among related institutions.



HISTORY

The University of Arts was established on June 10, 1957, as the Academy of Arts, a union of the existing higher art schools (academies). Until then independent, the Academy of Music (founded in 1937), the Academy of Fine Arts (founded in 1937), the Academy of Applied Arts (founded in 1948) and the Academy of Theatrical Arts (founded in 1948) became the Academy of Art, an association of higher art schools in Belgrade.

In 1973, these four academies, being the only higher art schools in Serbia at that time, became faculties: the Faculty of Fine Arts, the Faculty of Music, the Faculty of Applied Arts and Design and the Faculty of Dramatic Arts (theater, film, radio and television). Being their association, the then Academy of Arts became the University of Arts in Belgrade.

FACULTY OF FINE ARTS

Promoting high-level artistic creation, the Faculty of Fine Arts has an essential place in Serbian stage of visual art and culture. In 1921, the state Art School was established and achieved significant results. Education on the university level began in 1937, with the foundation of the Academy of Fine Arts, which was renamed The Faculty of Fine Arts in 1973.

In almost eight decades of its existence, the Faculty has fostered studio based practical work, abundance of poetics and multiple fields of experimentation. The most eminent artists from the region worked at the Faculty, 16 of which are members of the Serbian Academy of Sciences.

The Faculty of Fine Arts comprises about 350 students and 57 teachers and associates on all levels of studies.

FACULTY OF APPLIED ARTS

The Faculty of Applied Arts was founded more than six decades ago. At the beginning of the XX century, far back in 1905, the Arts and Crafts School was founded in Belgrade. Emulating programme and ideas of Bauhaus, in 1938 it became the School for Applied Art. The first higher education institution in the field of applied arts, The Academy of Applied Arts, began its first academic year in 1948. In 1973, the Academy was renamed the Faculty of Applied Arts. The Faculty offers a broad spectrum of disciplines that are classified as applied arts and design, complemented by conceptual reflection and theoretical research.

The Faculty of Applied Arts is home to about 730 students and 96 teachers and associates.

FACULTY OF DRAMATIC ARTS

The Faculty of Dramatic Arts is Serbia's largest school of higher education in theatre, film, radio and television and other performing arts. Outstanding in all areas, the Faculty is devoted both to the development of student's individual artistic voice and professional standard of student productions. The Faculty's most celebrated graduates permeate the whole of our cultural-artistic environment. Teachers and associates at all departments are most renowned artists, theoreticians and experts from the fields of dramatic and audiovisual arts.

The Faculty's roots extend far back in time. As early as in 1869, the first acting school in Belgrade was founded within the National Theatre. Higher education in the field of dramatic arts began in 1937, with the Department of Drama at the newly founded Music Academy and High School for Film ten years later. Today's Faculty was established in 1948 as the Academy of Theatre Arts, which in 1974 became part of the University of Arts.

The Faculty has about 560 students, 121 teachers and associates.

INTERDISCIPLINARY STUDIES



New artistic and theoretical practices are studied, connecting studies of artistic fields at certain faculties of art. Since its foundation, the Centre has developed rapidly, raising the quality of postgraduate studies and representing an academic challenge for an increasing number of domestic and foreign students. Interdisciplinary studies represent a significant developmental activity of the University of Arts, which strengthens the ties between the University and its faculties, promoting cooperation of professors from art faculties, as well as experts from different areas.
